Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2018-2019 educational progress for Holly Middle School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2018-2019 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given..

Our school has been given a Targeted Support and Improvement label for the 2018-2019 school year. For the 2019-2020 school year Holly Middle School is focusing on two challenge areas identified in the combined report, math and English-language arts proficiency. In addressing our challenges in math proficiency, HMS has embarked on the following initiatives: data analysis using M-Step "Crosswalk" and "Target Analysis" information along with PSAT 8 Question Analysis Reports to identify strengths and areas of concern while informing the scope and sequence in our instruction, utilizing the i-Ready math diagnostic platform three times per year allowing teachers to identify areas of concern in student skills in a more timely manner, revamping our Math Skills course while utilizing i-Ready instruction which scientifically analyzes student needs and creates a path to build these skills, creating a 6th grade Advanced Math class to more appropriately challenge students, deconstructing CCSS to create daily learning targets and utilizing consultants from the ISD and district Math Coaches to break down data and determine paths for improvement. In addressing our challenges in English-language arts proficiency, HMS has embarked on the following initiatives: data analysis using M-Step "Crosswalk" and "Target Analysis" information along with PSAT 8 Question Analysis Reports to identify strengths and areas of concern while informing the scope and sequence in our instruction, working with the ISD consultants to develop a professional

learning and inquiry cycle around Disciplinary Literacy, a team of teachers will train at the Disciplinary Literacy Summer Institute. This team will work with Oakland Schools consultants to develop professional learning for all staff. All staff will participate in developing skills

around Disciplinary Literacy, the Inquiry Cycle, Question Formulation Technique (QFT), and the Essential Practices focusing on Practice #1 - Inquiry Based Instruction.

Holly Area School District students from Davisburg Elementary, Holly Elementary, Patterson Elementary, and Rose Pioneer Elementary are assigned to Holly Middle School. Students who reside out of the Holly Area School District may exercise their option to attend Holly Middle School through Schools of Choice.

Holly Middle School is fully accredited with the North Central Association Commission on Accreditation and School Improvement (NCA/AdvancED). Recently the Holly Area School District earned Systems Accreditation from AdvancED. The <u>School Improvement Plan</u> for Holly Middle School is targeted to increase student achievement by improving overall proficiency in English Language Arts, Math, and student accountability.

Core Curriculum for Holly Middle School students is based on the Michigan State Standards. These standards can be accessed on our <u>website</u> at or the <u>Michigan Department of Education</u> (MDE). Holly Area Schools Atlas Rubicon Units of Study have been implemented in all content areas. Curriculum and common assessment writing aligned to the standards is a work in progress and continuous cycles of improvement using our district wide Data Protocol Process. <u>Atlas Rubicon Units of Study</u> are accessible for parents online.
