Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2016-17 educational progress for Holly Middle School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2016-17 school year, schools were identified using new definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels for the 2016-2017 school year. For the 2016-2017 school year Holly Middle School is focusing on two of our major challenges identified in the combined report, math and English-language arts proficiency. In addressing our challenges in math proficiency, HMS has embarked on the following initiatives: data analysis using M-Step "Crosswalk" and "Target Analysis" information to identify strengths and areas of concern while informing the scope and sequence in our instruction, engaging in professional learning to develop our Big Ideas Math curriculum, continuing with the i-Ready diagnostic platform three times per year allowing teachers to identify areas of concern in student skills in a more timely manner, utilizing the i-Ready instructional piece in our Math Skills course which scientifically analyzes student needs and creates a path to build these skills, instituting a comprehensive 6th grade Math Skills program to develop targeted areas of need, deconstructing CCSS to create daily learning targets and in all classes across the building students are analyzing graphs and supporting their ideas with evidence. In addressing our challenges in English-language arts proficiency, HMS has embarked on the following initiatives: data analysis using M-Step "Crosswalk" and "Target Analysis" information to identify strengths and areas of concern while informing the scope and sequence in our instruction, beginning our 2nd year of building wide professional development for staff around the Gradual Release of Responsibility method of instruction (a 3 year plan), deconstructing CCSS to create daily learning targets and in all classes across the building students are using evidence from informational text to support their ideas.

Holly Area School District students from Davisburg Elementary, Holly Elementary, Patterson Elementary, and Rose Pioneer Elementary are assigned to Holly Middle School. Students who reside out of the Holly Area School District may exercise their option to attend Holly Middle School through Schools of Choice.

Holly Middle School is fully accredited with the North Central Association Commission on Accreditation and School Improvement (NCA/AdvancED). Recently the Holly Area School District earned Systems Accreditation from AdvancED. The School Improvement Plan for Holly Middle School is targeted to increase student achievement by improving overall proficiency in English Language Arts, Math, and student accountability. Core Curriculum for Holly Middle School students is based on the Michigan State Standards. These standards can be accessed on our <u>school website</u> or the <u>Michigan Department of Education</u> (MDE). Holly Area Schools Atlas Rubicon Units of Study have been implemented in all content areas. Curriculum and common assessment writing aligned to the standards is a work in progress and continuous cycles of improvement using our district wide Data Protocol Process.
