Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2017-18 educational progress for Rose Pioneer Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2017-18 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given. Rose Pioneer Elementary School has not been given one of these labels.

Our staff meets frequently in grade level configurations to review student achievement data and design rigorous common assessments that help us better understand the strengths and challenges of our learners. Teacher and administrator professional development has helped us to improve instructionally through enhanced student achievement data analysis and instructional action planning, including the integration of Multi Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) for all learners.

Holly Area Schools students are assigned to neighborhood schools through a process established at Central Office. In addition, Holly Area Schools accepts School of Choice students, as openings are available. Holly Area Schools' core curricula are in the process of becoming fully aligned with the State of Michigan standards in all subject areas. Our teachers, with the support of the office of Curriculum and Instruction, review and update each curriculum, which is maintained electronically using the Atlas Rubicon platform. Parent involvement is foundational to our success at Rose Pioneer. During the 2017-2018 school year, ninety-nine percent (294 out of 295) of our parents attended student-led conferences. During the 2018-2019 school year, ninety-four percent (274 out of 291) of our parents attended student-led conferences.
