

*Honors & AP Course Eligibility

- Placement factors for Honors or AP Course requests
 - College Readiness (PSAT benchmark)
 - AP Potential (College Board measure)
 - Prior academic performance
 - Commitment to academic rigor
 - Teacher Recommendation
 - AP Contract must be signed
- To apply, interested students must write in on course request sheet and get current teacher's signature for approval

Testing Out For Course Advancement

- State of Michigan allows students to test out of any course.
- ❖ Must score an 80% (B-) or higher on the test
- Test Out is not a form of Credit Recovery
- Test Out is not an option for early graduation
- To apply, students must complete online application no later than May 1st (on HHS Counselor website)
- Testing takes place in May 2024

- Dual Enrollment, Early College, U of M Deep, OCC
- High school students can DUAL ENROLL in courses at specific local colleges or universities in an effort to accelerate college and career-readiness

- Apply for NCAA eligibility through the website www.eligibilitycenter.org
- Take 2 years of the same World Language
- Fulfill the 16 core credits required by NCAA
 - DI and DII schools enforce strict academic rules for athletes
