# College Considerations

- Location (type of Community)
- Costs: Scholarship and Financial Aid
- Campus Activities/Athletic Programs
- Academic reputation
- Public or Private
- Support Services





- Meet with an admissions Counselor
- Verify admission Requirements
- Determine the actual cost
- Ask about financial aid opportunities
- Take a campus Tour
- Schedule a meeting with a department advisor of your field of study
- Talk with students who attend

- Grade Trends

#### **Course Selection**

- -Rigorous Course Selection
- -Types of Courses—Specifically taking
- 4 core courses all 4 years
  - -Advanced Placement

# What are colleges looking for?

#### ACT/SAT

- Score ranges are dependent upon individual School admission requirements
- Many schools are not requiring test scores any longer, however you should take and send the ACT or SAT if you are interested in Scholarships
- Some schools ask for test scores for honors placement





#### SAT TEST/MME

**April 2024** – Given at HHS for FREE as a part of the MME (Michigan Merit Exam)

- SAT can be taken on your own by registering at College Board website <a href="https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/sat/register">https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/sat/register</a>
- You can take the SAT or ACT multiple times; colleges will take your best score
  - ACT can be taken by registering at <a href="https://www.act.org">www.act.org</a>

# College Application Process

#### WATCH those DEADLINES!!!

- ~Processing times or college applications varies
- ~Applications need to be submitted on Sept 30 that has a Oct I deadline WILL NOT GET THERE ON TIME!
- ~Submit college applications by **November 1st** for early decision deadlines (this is important for institutional aid eligibility). Deadlines vary but many have Feb 1st deadline
- ~We recommend having your FAFSA completed by November 1st as well! The FAFSA window opens October 1st.
- ~Applications are only considered complete once colleges receive all materials including materials from teachers and counselors. This is why it is important to give your teachers enough time



# Transcript Submission

- Visit <u>www.parchment.com</u>
- Create an account
- Follow the instructions for selecting college to which your transcript should be sent
- Pay required fees (varies by university)



# College Application Process

What do colleges do once they have the students application?

- Accept or Deny
- Ask the student to provide more info
- Defer decision & ask student to submit Ist trimester grades





#### ~Filling out the Common Application takes time

The following will be asked for:

- High School Transcript
- Activities, work, and family obligations
- Test scores
- Parent and legal guardian info
- Academic honors and achievements

Common Application Presentation for Students will be held on 10/13/2022 during Advisory. Make sure your student signs up with their advisory teachers.





- Colleges reps will come to HHS to discuss their campus & programs
- Find a list of colleges scheduled to come on the counseling office

- . Sign-up is in the counseling office
  - Pick up a permission slip and must have it signed by your teacher





- Student athletes who plan on playing Division I or Division II athletics should see their counselor to discuss eligibility.
- NCAA maintains eligibility for Division I & Division II public universities. NAIA maintains eligibility for private universities.

# What are colleges looking for?

#### Essays

- Not all schools require essays
- Essays are important for colleges that require them, this is your opportunity to show your personality and your passion

#### Recommendations

- Not all colleges require letters
- Give teachers ample time when requesting a letter
- Complete the google letter of recommendation form from your counselor

## SENIOR YEAR



- ~Counselors have "senior meetings" in September.
- Individual senior meetings with each student in the fall to discuss post-secondary plans and credits.
- ~Credit status letters are mailed to parents in October.
  - ~Keep grades up Most colleges ask for senior grades and they can reverse their decision!
    - Stay involved in school and/or community for scholarships
    - Volunteer service for future scholarships and college applications.

# FAFSA Free Application for Federal and State Aid FAFSA Night February 22nd @HHS

Visit <u>www.fafsa.ed.gov</u> to submit the free application for federal and state aid. *FAFSA also now has a mobile app that you can use to apply.* Must fill out the FAFSA to get financial aid. (aid=grants, scholarships, loans)

Complete the FAFSA as soon as possible – this will help you secure scholarship money before it's gone! **THE FAFSA WINDOW OPENS OCTOBER 1, 2022 and students should apply as close to this date as possible, because many schools award money on a first come first serve basis!** 

**March 1, 2023** is the absolute deadline for most schools.

You and your parent have separate pieces of the FAFSA to complete, each requiring their own PIN number.

- -"The scholarship is guaranteed or your money back."
- "You can't get this information anywhere else."
- "I just need your credit card or bank account number to hold this scholarship."
- "We'll do all the work."
- —"The scholarship will cost some money."
- -"You've been selected by a 'national foundation' to receive a scholarship" or "You're a finalist" in a contest you never entered
